Introduction and Synopsis

The Indian Council for Cultural Relations was formally set up in 1950, with the primary objective of establishing, reviving and strengthening cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries. Its aims, as enunciated in the **Memorandum of Association**, are:

- * To **participate** in the formulation and implementation of policies and programmes relating to India's cultural relations with other countries;
- * To **foster and strengthen** cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries;
- * To **establish and develop** relations with national and international organizations in the field of culture.

The Council has worked steadily to attain these objectives.

The major activities of the Council include:

- * Administration of scholarship schemes for overseas students on behalf of the Government of India and other agencies, and to supervise the welfare of international students;
- * Grant of scholarships to foreign students to learn Indian dance and music;
- * Exchange of Exhibitions;
- * Organization of and participation in international seminars and symposia;
- * Participation in major cultural festivals abroad;
- * Organization of 'Festivals of India' abroad;
- * Exchange of groups of performing artistes;
- * Organization of lecture-demonstrations by performing artistes abroad;
- * To maintain the Distinguished Visitors Programme, under which eminent personalities from abroad are invited to India and Indian experts are sent abroad to deliver lectures on issues of mutual interest;
- * To establish and operate Chairs for Indian Studies in universities abroad;
- * Presentation of books, audio-visual material, art objects and musical instruments to institutions abroad;
- * To provide the Secretariat for the Jawaharlal Nehru Award for International Understanding; Organization of the annual Maulana Azad Memorial Lecture and the Maulana Azad Essay Competition;
- * The publication of books and journals for distribution in India and abroad;
- * The operation of Indian Cultural Centres abroad;
- * The maintenance of a well-stocked library and the manuscripts of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad;

- * The digitization of rare manuscripts;
- * Awarding of Library Fellowships, and
- * To undertake projects on behalf of the Ministry of External Affairs.

The activities of the Council are decided and approved by its Governing Body.

The Council received 13707.50 Lacs as Grant-in-Aid from the Ministry of External Affairs for the F/y 2011-12, Rs. 6262.36 Lacs from other agencies and Rs. 323.13 Lacs as Misc. receipts from other sources. The actual expenditure during the F/y 2011-12 was Rs.21447.88 Lacs.

The council is guided by its President and Statutory Bodies i.e. Governing Body, General Assembly and Finance Committee. These bodies comprises experts from all fields including representatives of Parliament, Cultural Academics, Government Nominees, Eminent Artists from the field of Fine and Plastic Arts, Universities/ Institutions including Scientific, Technical and Research institute and representatives of organizations interested in the objectives of the Council.

These Bodies provide policy Direction to the activities of the Council. These Bodies meet periodically to consider Important aspects including Budget, Plan of Action, etc. List of members of General Assembly, Governing Body and Finance Committees are at **Annexure-I, II and III** respectively.

Highlights of the Year 2011-2012

Celebration of 150th Birth Anniversary of Guru Rabindranath Tagore commencing from 7th May 2011. In this regard, the Council has organised four Tagore Conferences during the year in Nepal, Russia, India and Vietnam. Four Chairs of Tagore Study have established. One Chair in China, two in UK and One in Bangladesh.

Other major festivals organized in India during 2011-12 included 2nd International Dance Festival, Delhi International Arts Festival, Film Festival, South Asian Bands Festival, Buddhist International Performing Art Festival, Sufi Festival, Egyptian Cultural Week, 2nd Delhi Jazz Festival, Malhar Festival, Thumri Festival and Dhurupad Festival.

Other major festivals organized in Abroad during 2011-12 included Year of India in Canada, Festival of India in Iran, Brazil, South Korea, Russia and Saudi Arabia.

Council has organized 4 Buddhist Conferences namely in Vietnam, India, Taiwan & Singapore in this Financial year. Council also celebrated the 150th Birth Anniversary of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore commencing from 7th May, 2011 and has organized/organizing several conferences around the world on this occasion.

The Council opened its 37th Cultural Centre in The Hague (Netherlands) in October 2011.

The Regional Office in Bhopal and Jammu were opened in January 2012 and in March 2012 respectively.

A special Issue each of Indian Horizon and Rencontre Avec L' Inde on "Rabindra Nath Tagore" and a special issue of Thaqafat-ul-Hind on "Maulana Azad" were brought out in year in the report.

Scholarship programme of the Council is an important component of ICCR's activities. Under this programme, Council offered 2404 scholarship slots to the nationals of different countries mainly from neighbouring, African and Commonwealth Independent States(CIS) countries. Additionally, many welfare activities including summer / winter camps for International Students and celebration of International Student's day (11th November of every year) are also undertaken.

IV. Scholarship and Welfare of International Students

The Council administered 2404 scholarships during 2011-12 under various schemes for foreign students to pursue under-graduate, post-graduate and doctoral programmes as well as professional courses such as Engineering, Pharmacy, Accountancy, Business Administration and Management, etc. The thrust of the scholarship programme is towards developing nations with a special focus on India's neighbours.

Activities of the Scholarship Section Include:-

International Students Festival: To commemorate the 123rd Birth Anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the First Education Minister of Independent India and the Founder President of the ICCR, the Council organized the **"XIX International Students Festival"** called **"Friendship Through Culture"** on 12th November, 2011 at IGNCA, New Delhi. The International Students community from eighteen countries participated enthusiastically in this event by depicting representative aspects of the cultures of their respective countries. The ICCR's Regional Offices and some Indian Missions abroad also celebrated this festival.

Sumptuary Allowance: The Council released Sumptuary Allowance to International Students Advisors of various Universities hosting a considerable number of ICCR's scholars, in acknowledgement of their important role in ensuring the welfare of these scholars.

Summer/Winter Camps: The Council organized nine summer camps during May-June 2011 and fifteen winter camps during December-January 2011-2012 for the benefit of the Foreign Students. Details of scholarship schemes are given at **Annexure-IV**.

V. Indian Cultural Centres Abroad

The primary objective of the Council is to establish, revive and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries in order to promote awareness and appreciation of India's composite cultural heritage abroad. The Council has been attaching great importance to the implementation of its programmes & activities in South Asia. The Council is maintaining 37 Cultural Centres as on 31.3.2012. These are located in Cairo (Egypt), Berlin (Germany), Port Louis (Mauritius), Paramaribo (Suriname), Georgetown (Guyana), Jakarta

(Indonesia), Moscow (Russian Federation), London (U.K.), Almaty, (Kazakhstan), Tashkent (Uzbekistan), Durban and Johannesburg (South Africa), Port of Spain (Trinidad & Tobago), Colombo (Sri Lanka), Dushanbe (Tajikistan), Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia), Suva (Fiji), Tokyo (Japan), Kathmandu (Nepal), Kabul (Afghanistan), Beijing (China), Bangkok (Thailand), Abu Dhabi (UAE), Dhaka (Bangladesh), Mexico City(USA), Dar-es-Salaam (Tanzania), Sao Paulo (Brazil), Yangon (Myanmar), Seoul (South Korea), Prague (Czech Republic), Budapest (Hungary), Male (Maldives), Riyadh (Saudi Arabia), Paris (France), as well as 2 sub-Centres at Bali (Indonesia) and Lautoka (Fiji). The Council opened its 37th Cultural Centre at The Hague during the period under report.

During the financial period 2011-2012, the ICCR has taken initiative to establish a series of Indian Cultural Centres to expand our cultural reach and promote India's "Soft Power" abroad. Under its proposed expansion plan, the Council is furthering the opening of 15 Cultural Centres within 2 years time in our immediate neighbourhood, the extended neighbours, P-5 in capitals Africa and Latin America.

Through regular interaction and guidance for the Indian Cultural Centres, we have been able to increase both the number of programmes being organised, as well as the diversity of events. The objective has been to make our cultural Centres hubs for promoting Indian Culture through not only classes in dance and music, but also by organizing Exhibition of art & sculpture, Literacy events philosophy, history, sociology, economic trends, cinema in India etc. by both local experts and visitors from India. A number of Cultural Centres have started new activities such as Fusion Music events, Book Launches, Kavi Sammelans etc. The India based teachers deployed abroad have been encouraged to do "outreach activities" including visits to other cities and joint programmes with local institutions. Local resources are being increasingly utilized, such as using local experts to teach Indian dance and music, Yoga, etc. as these are much more cost effective than sending troupes from India. Instructions have also been given to all Cultural Centres to start Hindi classes, which have been implemented.

Emphasis has been attached to providing intellectual inputs by organizing Conference and Seminars and setting up Chairs. Many of our Centres, which were earlier following a set routine of taking classes in dance & music, have now become more pro-active and are organizing many more varied and high profile events. Several Cultural Centres have also organised large scale and multi-faceted festivals.

VI. Chairs of Indian Studies abroad

ICCR, in consultation with Indian Missions abroad, has established Chairs of Indian Studies in various foreign universities. The purpose of these Chairs, apart from to educating foreign students about India, is to become a nucleus around which Indian Studies could develop in academic institutions abroad. The academics/ scholars deputed to these Chairs not only teach courses related to India, but through other academic activities like research guidance, seminar coordination, publications, delivering public lectures, develop scholarly interactions with the academics of that country and assist in disseminating information and a better appreciation of various India related issues.

ICCR has now 91 Chairs abroad out of which 17 Chairs were established in the financial year 2011-12 (till 31.01.2012). These new Chairs are located in Armenia (Contemporary Indian Studies), Australia (Contemporary Indian Studies), Bangladesh (Tagore Chair), Brazil (Indian Studies), China (Tagore Chair), Czech Republic (Hindi & Indian Culture), Denmark (Contemporary Indian Studies), Nepal (Business Studies), Russia (Contemporary Indian Studies), Sweden (Contemporary Indian Studies), Switzerland (Hindi & Indian Culture) Taiwan (Indian Economy/Developmental Studies), Thailand (Contemporary Indian Studies), UK (2 Chairs, Contemporary Indian Studies & Tagore Chair) and USA (2 Chairs, one chair in Indo-US Relations and Indian Society & Culture).

VII. Conferences and Seminars

During the period April, 2011 to March, 2012 the Council assisted various Universities in organizing Conference/Seminar/Symposium on the subject related to Culture. The major Universities assisted by the ICCR are Jawaharlal Nehru University, University of Delhi, Jamia Millia Islamia University, Indian Institute of Advanced Studies, Shimla, Institute of Defence Study and Analysis, Sagar University, Sagar and University of Madras. The Council has organized 4 Buddhist Conferences namely in Vietnam, India, Taiwan & Singapore in this Financial year. Council also celebrated the 150th Birth Anniversary of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore commencing from 7th May, 2011 and has organized/organizing several conferences around the world on this occasion. Council has organized 4 Tagore Conferences till now in Nepal, Russia, India & Vietnam.

Council also organized an International Buddhist Conference in Leh, Ladakh in September, 2011 which was a huge success along with an International Tagore Conference at Azad Bhawan, New Delhi during 10-12 October, 2011. The Conference was inaugurated by Hon'ble Finance Minister, Shri Pranab Mukherjee and the Keynote address was given by Prof. Amiya Bagchi. The conference was very much appreciated by the scholars.

VIII. Bust

The Council has an ongoing programme of presenting busts and statues of great Indian leaders for ceremonial installation in other countries. Details are given at **Annexure VIII**

IX. Fellowship

Council also received 3 Fellows, 1 Senior Fellow from Sweden and 2 Junior Fellows respectively from Slovenia and Nepal.

Other Fellows who had joined last year also continued to pursue their research this year in their respective Universities.

X. Multimedia

The Council has commissioned a short feature film on the activities of ICCR. Purpose of commissioning the film is to introduce the world, the activities being undertaken by ICCR.

XI. Forum of Friends of ICCR (FFOI)

Members are enrolled for life against submission of nominal fee. The members are kept apprised of the Council's activities through invitation & email.

XII. Outgoing Cultural Delegations

The Council sponsored 139 groups to present varied forms of Indian dance, music and other performing arts abroad. The performances rendered by them included classical, contemporary, tribal and folk art forms. Priority was accorded to participation in major cultural festivals so as to generate greater interest in Indian cultural strengths and accomplishments.

XIII. Incoming Cultural Delegations and Cultural Performances in India

The Council handles foreign cultural groups visiting the country in and outside the Cultural Exchange Programme ever since Council's inception. Usually, the group from abroad is hosted by the Council under CEP on reciprocity basis. During the past six decades, the organization has organised hundreds of cultural events including cultural weeks and cultural Festival dedicated to a specific country/region/continent. One of the primary mandates of the Council is to create an international understanding through culture. In this exercise, the Council showcase good quality performance by the visiting cultural group from all over the globe to the people of India. Besides, general cultural performances, the following main festivals have organised during the year:

International Jazz Festival:- The Council organized the International Jazz Festival from 7th to 11th April, 2011 in New Delhi with the collaboration of M/s SEHER, a Delhi based NGO. The Festival was attended and inaugurated by Dr Karan Singh, President, ICCR, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi and Shri Suresh K Goel, Director General of ICCR. The above Festival was very well appreciated by audience, media and VIPs. Apart from the India, International groups also participated in the above Festival i.e. Italy, Sweden, France, Scotland, Germany and Canada.

2nd International Dance Festival:-

The Council organized contemporary and folk dance performances from groups of foreign nationals from Argentina, South Africa, Germany, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and UK in different parts of the country from 23 October to 1 November 2011.

South Asian Bands Festival 2011

On behalf of MEA, the Council in collaboration with SEHER had organized a hugely successful 3-day South Asian Bands Festival during 2-4 December, 2011 in Delhi. These bands also performed at concerned Regional Offices of the Council, viz, Jaipur, Thiruvananthapuram, Lucknow, Guwahati and Shillong.

Delhi International Arts Festival (DIAF)

During the period 2011-12, the Council had organized Delhi International Arts Festival in the month of October-November, 2011. In this connection, the Council had invited groups from Colombia, UK, Hungary, Spain, Bangladesh, South Africa, Santiniketan (from India), Egypt, Israel, France, Italy, Korea, Japan, Malaysia, Iran, Russia, Australia, Sri Lanka, Canada, Nepal, Pakistan and Mexico.

Egyptian Cultural Week

The Council organized contemporary & folk dance & music performances by groups from Egypt from 28 January to 3rd February 2012.

Sufi Festival

The Council organized a Sufi festival from 6th February to 9th February 2012 in different parts of the country performances by groups from Delhi, Kashmir, Kolkata, Egypt, Hungary, Denmark and Morocco.

2nd Delhi Jazz Festival

The Council organized 2nd Jazz Festival from 16 to 18 March 2012, performances by the groups from Poland, France, Georgia, Germany, Mexico and Spain.

XIV. Foreign Cultural Centres

The Council continued to administer the British Council Libraries and coordinate the activities of the Foreign Cultural Centres in India.

XV. Distinguished Visitors Programme

As part of our efforts to foster and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries, ICCR administers a "Distinguished Visitors Programme". Under this programme, the Council invites writers, scholars, intellectuals, opinion-makers,

academics, artistes, etc., in the field of politics, academics, art & culture to India from abroad to expose them to the various facets of Indian life and society. Leading representatives of think-tanks and cultural institutions are also invited to share their insight and experiences. The distinguished visitors found this programme extremely useful and expressed their desire to visit India again. Some of the Important persons who visited under DVP Included Prof. Zhang Bigong (President, Shenzhen University, China), Madam Song Xinyan (Vice President, All-China, Women's Federation), Dr. Jayamapathy Wickramaratne, P.C. XVI. Outgoing Visitors

In keeping with its effort to foster and strengthen cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and other countries, the Council also facilitates visits of Indian scholars, intellectuals, academicians and artistes to foreign countries under the Outgoing Visitors Programme (OVP). During the year, the Council sponsored visits by 72 eminent scholars to various parts of the world.

ICCR has been actively engaged in its efforts to strengthen academic and intellectual exchange between India and other foreign countries of the world. With a view to facilitate a more fruitful and intensify academic exchange, leading to a better appreciation of India's profile and global goal in the academic circles overseas, three new programmes were launched:-

Academic Visitors Programme:- Under this programme, the Council invites eminent academicians including PIO/NRI academicians, on the recommendation of HOM for 7 to 10 days. Economy class air ticket is provided and entire local hospitality is arranged by the Council. During the period, the Council invited 10 eminent academicians.

Study Visit by Indian Scholars Abroad:- Indian Scholars, registered with recognized institutions of learning for further research in the area of their specialization, are allowed to visit Universities and Institutions abroad, provided, they are accepted by such institutions of learning. The period of such visit is up to a maximum of 3 months. They are provided economy class return air fare and a stipend of US\$2000/- per month.

Junior Fellowship Programme :- Foreign Ph.D/ Post Doctoral Research scholars wishing to do field work for research in India, in connection with their existing projects, are considered under this programme. They are eligible for international air fare by economy class and are provided all inclusive a stipend of US\$1000/- per month up to maximum period of 12 months. The applications need to be routed through our Mission abroad.

XVII. Festivals of India

Year of India in Canada

The Festival Unit of the Council coordinated various events for the Year of India in Canada, which started on 2nd March, 2010 with the performance of Ustad Amjad Ali Khan alongwith 7-members. The Festival was based on contemporary/ classical dance and music comprised of 12 performing arts groups from various parts of India. It was concluded in October, 2011 when ICCR organised a Closing Ceremony of the Year of India In Canada with a performance by 40-Bollywood groups led by Ms. Ila Arun from 16-30 October 2011.

The Council organised an India Africa Summit-II in Ethiopia from 9th to 26th May 2011 performed by Guru Rajender Gangani's group.

Festival of India in Iran

The Council organised the Festival of India in Iran inaugurated by Shri Syed Shahid Mahdi, Vice President, ICCR on 10th May 2011 in Tehran. During the festival, many performances were given by Abhay Sopory's group and a Rajasthani Folk group led by Shri Bundu Khan. It was continue till 22nd May 2011.

Festival of India in Brazil

The Council organised a Festival of India In Brazil from 17th May to 6th June, 2011. During the festival, many performances were performed by the five cultural groups led by Ms. Anuradha Pal (Recharge Band group), Ms. Arunima Kumar (Kuchipuddi Dance group), Ms. Ananda Shankar (Contemporary Dance group), Shri Abhay Rustum Sopory (Santoor group) and Dr. L Subramanyam's (Villon group).

Festival of India in South Korea

The Council organised a Festival of India in South Korea from 30th June 2011 to 10th March 2012. The Festival was based on contemporary performances performed by the ten cultural groups by Odissi Dance Group led by Ms. Ranjana Gohar, Contemporary Dance Group led by Ms. Mallika Sarabhai, Mrigya Band led by Mr. Rajat Kakkar, Contemporary Dance Group led by Ms. Daksha Seth, Theatre Group led by Mr. Rajit Kapur, Rajasthani Group led by Shri Kassim, Bollywood Group led by Ms. Penaz Masani, Odissi Dance Group led by Ms. Kavita Dwibedi, Bharatnatyam Dance group of Ms. Rama Valdyanathan and Panchvadya group led by Shri Padinhare Kizhikkilot Kunhi Raman.

Festival of Indian Cultures In Russia

This festival was organised by the Council in Russia from 14th Sept to 1st Oct 2011. During the festival a Bollywood group to team work performed programmes in Russia and China, a folk group Halar Lok Kala Kenders of Shri J C Jadeja performed in the festival.

Festival of India in Saudi Arabia

The Council organised a Festival of India in Saudi Arabia and UEA. During the festival, cultural performances were given by a Qawwali Group led by Shri Jamil Ahmed and by a Shehnai group led by Shri Daya Shankar.

XVIII. Publications

The Council has an ambitious publication programme, which has grown over the years. The Council brings out six Journals in five different languages, namely, "Indian Horizons" and "Africa Quarterly" (both English Quarterlies), "Gaganachal" (Hindi Quarterly), "Papeles de la India" (Spanish, bi-annual), "Rencontre Avec L' Inde" (French bi-annual) and "Thaqafat-ul-Hind" (Arabic Quarterly). In addition, various publications are commissioned by ICCR every year, from records of seminars and conferences, to exhibition and programme brochures and booklets.

A special issue each of Indian Horizon and Rencontre Avec L' Inde on "Rabindra Nath Tagore" and a special Issue of Thaqafat-ul-Hind on Maulana Azad are also brought out.

XIX. Exhibitions

An important aspect of the Council's work is projection of India abroad, not only through its rich cultural heritage but also through its contemporary achievements. The Council regularly sponsors exhibitions of India's contemporary and traditional arts in major festivals and art events abroad. Under the bilateral Cultural Exchange Programmes with other countries and under its own programme of activities, ICCR sponsors exhibitions of Indian art and crafts to foreign countries and receives exhibitions from abroad for expositions in India.

The ICCR sent the following major exhibitions (All from ICCR's own collection) abroad during the year:

1. Exhibition of "Women by Women" to Algeria from December, 2007 to onward.
2. "SAARC Paintings Exhibition" to Iran and Turkmenistan for display purposes from July to November, 2011.
3. Photographic Exhibition "The Murals of India" to Mauritius, Sri Lanka from April to November, 2011. Presented to ICC, Colombo, Sri Lanka for permanent display.

XXI. Library

The personal collection of books and manuscripts bequeathed by Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the Founder President of the Council, forms the core of the ICCR Library. A catalogue of the manuscripts and personal books of Maulana Azad has been printed in book form in three languages - Arabic, Urdu and Persian. The Council also undertook an exercise to preserve the rare manuscripts available with it. Over the decades, the library has grown considerably and presently has more than 50,000 volumes.

XXII. Regional Offices

The Council's Regional Offices continue to function in Bangalore, Chandigarh, Chennai, Goa, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai, Thiruvananthapuram, Jaipur, Pune, Varanasi, Shillong, Cuttack, Guwahati, Bhopal and Jammu. The activities of the Regional Offices included coordination with local bodies/organizations & providing assistance to foreign students studying under the Council's scholarships schemes. The Regional Offices also extended logistical facilities to incoming and outgoing cultural delegations & to the Council's distinguished visitors.

The Regional Offices in Bhopal and Jammu were started functioning from January and March 2012 respectively. Regional Advisory Committees also guide ICCR with Plan & Policy with specific emphasis on Regional Cultural issues.

XXIII ICCR's plans for the near future

ICCR plans to continue on its path of expanding and further strengthening its relations and activities in the cultural arena in the foreseeable future. The year - long celebration of Vivekananda's birth anniversary started in 2011-12 will continue in 2012-13. Cultural Centres in Washington, Paris, Toronto, Sydney, Singapore, Buenos Aires (Argentina), Hanoi and Logos are proposed to be opened in the coming years. 10 Chairs are planned for 2012-13. Negotiations are going on with universities to formalize MOUs for establishment of more Chairs. ICCR propose to open new Regional Offices at Dehradun, Port Blair and Gangtok in the next two years. The schedule of festivals, exhibitions, conferences and seminars will continue with increased vigour as well as the scholarship programme, where ICCR is also sponsoring training in the English language to bring incoming foreign students up to university level standards to enable them to get the most out of their educational experience in India. An ambitious programme for digitalization of archival materials available with ICCR is also being planned. The renovation of Azad Bhawan and the restoration of Africa House is also on the anvil, as also the introduction of Recruitment Rules and Financial Rules for ICCR. The Council proposes to organise "Europalia-India" festival in 2013-14 in Belgium. Also festival of India in Australia, Mexico, Russia are planned to be organised. Additionally, Indo-Arab Summit and IOR-ARC festivals are also planned.

XXIV. Accounts
